Scholarship Award Guidelines

Please Read Carefully and Save for Future Reference

Entering Applicant: Proof of enrollment in a post-secondary education program (i.e. university, college, trade or vocational school) of the student's choice must be submitted to the Woman's Club Scholarship Committee prior to the release of funds for the first semester. You must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours of academic work. The rules below apply for the semester specified. Information must be submitted by **August 1st**.

ALL SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Scholarship awards are not automatically ongoing. Students must reapply each semester by sending the following to the Scholarship Committee, by **August 1st** for the fall semester and **January 4th** for the spring semester.

1. A personal letter discussing the student's goals, objectives, and achievements including extracurricular activities and how the scholarship money was utilized.
2. A copy of the student's official grade transcript for the prior semester.
3. A proof of enrollment in a minimum of 12 hours of classes for current semester.

GRADES

All students must maintain a "C" average each semester.

If a student fails to achieve the required grade point average, no award will be given for the next semester. However, the student may reapply when the required grade point average is achieved by submitting a letter, transcript and proof of class enrollment for the current semester.

Since the number and value of all awards are determined yearly by the success of the Boca Grande Woman's Club in its fund raising efforts, there is no guarantee for the continuation of an award or of a specific dollar amount of each semester's awards.

It is recommended that the use of scholarship monies and personal tax ramifications be discussed with a tax advisor. It is not the responsibility of the Woman's Club.

To All Prospective Applicants for Scholarship Awards:

Please Read Carefully and Save for Future Reference

The Boca Grande Woman's Club offers scholarship assistance each year to a selected number of Boca Grande students graduating from accredited high schools and to qualified adults primarily employed on Boca Grande. The awards are made on a semester basis, but they are not automatically ongoing. They must be applied for each semester and are subject to the student's continued academic standing and financial need.

An applicant seeking an award must:

1. Have applied for admission to a school for post-secondary education, such as a university, college, trade or vocational school.
2. Demonstrate a **B** or better high school average.
3. Meet Island Connection:
 - a. reside in Boca Grande, or
 - b. be the child or grandchild of such resident, or
 - c. be the child of a parent, grandparent, or guardian currently employed on Boca Grande who has been employed a minimum of two years and whose primary source of income comes from work on Boca Grande, or
 - d. be an applicant who personally contributes to the Boca Grande community and has documentation of employment and / or volunteer work for a minimum of 20 hours per week for at least 40 weeks over a two year period.
4. Complete FAFSA form – go to **fafsa.gov** online and submit current SAR (Student Aid Report) as part of the application.
5. Complete the BGWC Scholarship Application, and submit the letters of recommendations.

- 1) Include a letter to the Scholarship Committee that explains in detail (1) intended educational goals (2) something from your life experience that has helped to shape who you are (3) techniques you have found helpful to decrease stress in your life.
- 2) Include three recommendations; two must come from teachers, and one from the community.
- 3) Include an official transcript of your high school grades.
- 4) Include the SAR report.
- 5) Include a recent photo.

BGWC Scholarship Graduate Exit Interview

In an effort to maintain a BGWC Scholarship Graduate Database, we require a formal commitment from you to participate in a short follow-up survey upon your graduation. A Scholarship Committee Advocate will conduct this interview, preferably by phone, in order to obtain the required information.

The follow-up interview will be scheduled by your Advocate prior to the release of your final semester scholarship award.

I authorize the BGWC Scholarship Committee to contact me as a means of completing the Graduate Exit Interview, and further agree to willingly participate in this survey as one of the requirements for receipt of the BGWC Scholarship. (This information to be used exclusively by the BGWC will not be shared.)

Scholarships will be awarded at the discretion of the Woman's Club Scholarship Committee after completion of the application review and student interview. Submission of this application gives permission to the members of the BGWC Scholarship Committee and/or Executive Board to make inquiries to employers, recommenders, or other appropriate individuals to confirm the applicant's Island connection.
